The next and closely linked step in the Risk Assessment process is the Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR). An SPR is a self assessment of an entity's current risk levels and adaptation capacity. SPRs are often used to compare data over time and help avoid duplication of effort.

Who uses SPRs?

Stakeholder Preparedness Reviews can be conducted at any jurisdictional level. They are purposefully flexible to allow for planners, managers, and officials to properly assess their entity's Preparedness from an extremely localized level all the way to a large regional one.
